## Support for survivors of domestic abuse?

Are you in contact with a victim of domestic abuse?

Have they experienced violence, controlling or coercive behaviour or abuse from a partner or ex, or by a family member?

This abuse can include (but is not limited to):

• Psychological

• Physical

Sexual

• Financial

• Emotional

If they have been through any of the above, then SIDASS is here to offer help and support.

# What can SIDASS do?

SIDASS provide support, emergency safety planning and advocacy to all domestic abuse survivors across Salford. This includes:

- Survivors age 16 and above
- Men and women
- All DASH risk levels
- Survivors in need of a refuge
- Those experiencing honour based violence and forced marriage
- Survivors who choose not to report to the police

We can help them with the following:

- Support over the telephone or face to face in a safe place
- Initial crisis support, providing information and options
- Assess the level of risk they are facing and create a safety plan
- Advocate on their behalf with other agencies, such as police, children's services, housing, and more
- Referrals for safe accommodation in our refuges (please note that places can depend on availability)
- Support with going to court, attending trials and court results
- Access to our in-house solicitor, specialising in Protective Orders and child contact issues

#### How can my service refer?

Client consent <u>must</u> be obtained for SIDASS to provide support.

Organisations operating within the Salford Community Safety Partnership can refer by submitting a completed DASH RIC to SIDASS@salford.gov.uk.

Organisations operating outside the Salford Community Safety Partnership can refer by visiting our website at salfordwomensaid.org where a Non-DASH Agencies referral form can be downloaded and completed. This should be emailed to SIDASS@salford.gov.uk.

If a client is identified as high risk, or scores 14 or more on the risk assessment, the referral should be uploaded to share point and heard at the next MARAC meeting.
